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## Adding suffixes to words that need a double final consonant

## 1. Review Your List Words

Look at the list words below and read each word to yourself. Then review each definition.

When a one-syllable word ends with a single vowel followed by a single consonant, you need to double the final consonant before adding a suffix.
Example: shop + er = shopper

When a word with more than one syllable ends with a single vowel followed by a single consonant, and the emphasis in pronunciation is placed on the last syllable in the word, then you double the final consonant before adding the suffix.

Example: begin $+\mathrm{ing}=$ beginning
