


In the box below, I'd like you to draw pictures to show what you know about Him and how He wants you to live.

Note to Teacher:

The character trait for this lesson is humble, which will be introduced later. We will build on the idea that it takes humility to grow.



As we learn about God, we will be looking at accounts from the Bible that tell us the history of the world through people, places, and events. An account is a story. The stories we find in the Bible aren't like any other story you find on a bookshelf. The Bible stories or accounts that we are going to talk about are about real people and real things that really happened. The Bible is full of God's words to us. He wanted to be sure we knew the truth, so He gave us the Bible. Other books and stories on your shelves might be pretend stories, but everything in the Bible is always true!

TIME IN THE TRUTH

At the beginning of time, God created everything in just six days! Follow the timeline below to see what He did each day.



After God finished creating, He said everything was very good. He then rested on the seventh day.

(Summary based on Genesis 1; 2:1-2)

God is wise. We can see that He is wise when we look at the creation story. Plants need the sun in order to grow. If God waited more than a day, the plants would have died while they were waiting for the sun to be created! He knew the perfect order to create everything exactly when it was needed.

Let's Chat! What do you think "wise" means? What does it mean when we say that God is wise?

(Student's response)

When someone is wise, it shows that they make good decisions. They choose the right thing. God always makes the best decisions! The creation story shows us that God is wise.

Let's Write! What does the creation story show us?

Close your eyes to imagine a baby girl crying for milk. Nothing will make her happy

until she is fed! She needs the milk in order to grow. This is how we should feel about the Bible. We should want to keep learning more of what it says because that is how we grow in our faith! When you say your verse today, start by lying on the floor. Slowly get up as you are saying the words and finish the verse on the tips of your toes, as tall as you can be! After you have practiced the verse three times, trace the words on the next page.

Let's Chat! We are going to start reading a little book today about the gospel. We will read a few pages each lesson and then talk about what we read. Have you heard the word "gospel" before? What do you think it means?

(Student's response)

The word "gospel" means good news. I'm excited to hear this good news!

Wow! Did you hear what the best news in the whole world is? God loves you and He wants you to be with Him forever! We need to get out a Bible and look up a verse in the New Testament. The New Testament is the second section of the Bible. Let's find John 3:16 and read it together.

This verse tells us that God loves us so much He sent Jesus to make a way for us to live with Him. As we continue reading through our little book about the gospel, we will find out how we can do that! This is another way we can see that God is wise. He created us, and He knows exactly what we need.

We are done reading in our little book about the gospel for today, but I don't want to lose our spot! Please cut out the bookmark below and decorate it however you would like.

Note to Teacher:

Find John 3:16 and read it aloud.

Note to Teacher:

If your student is asking questions about how to live with God forever, be sure to answer right away. It is best to answer your student's questions when they show interest.

Note to Teacher:

Cut a piece of card stock or cardboard to the size of the bookmark. Instruct your student to glue the decorated paper to the card stock.

Like newborn babies, long for the pure milk of the word, so that by it you may grow in respect to salvation. I Peter 2:2

Have you ever heard someone pray? Praying is simply talking to God. We can talk to God anywhere and at any time. This is an important part of growing in our faith. We don't have to write down the things we pray, but if we choose to write our prayers, it can help us remember to pray each day. There is a journal in the back of this book that you and your teacher will be using each lesson. Your part to fill out is a prayer journal. This journal will help you learn how to pray about different topics.

Jesus taught us how to pray in the Bible. Let's read what He said about prayer!

Pray, then, in this way:

"Our Father who is in heaven, Hallowed be Your name. Your kingdom come. Your will be done, On earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread. And forgive us our debts, as we also have forgiven our debtors. And do not lead us into temptation, but deliver us from evil. [For Yours is the kingdom and the power and the glory forever. Amen."] Matthew 6:9–13

When we pray, we don't have to say the exact words Jesus said, but we should pray about more than just the things we want God to give us. Jesus showed us how to pray about many things. We are going to use a model of prayer called the ACTS model. A is for Adore, C is for Confess, T is for Thanks, and S is for Supply.

Are you ready to pray? Turn to page 305 to read more about what each type of prayer is and then fill out your prayer journal for this lesson. You will find four sections to fill out. In each of the sections, you can draw or write what you'd like to pray about. After you've done this,

take some time to talk to God out loud about those things. Talking to God is just like talking to a person. Even though you can't see Him, He can hear what you are saying because He is with you. Psalm 145:18 says, "The Lord is near to all who call on Him." He loves to hear you pray!

Mr. Luke's challenge for this lesson has been a verse about growing in faith. In order to grow in faith, we need to be humble. Humble means that you think about yourself the way God thinks about you, and you also think about others the way God thinks about them. You are special! Other people are special! If you begin thinking you are *more* special than others, that is called pride. Pride is the opposite of being humble.

Someone with pride says, "I am better than everyone else, and I don't need to grow any more."

Someone who is humble says, "I am special, but I still have a lot of growing to do."

Think back to the verse you're memorizing. Does God want you to keep growing?

Note to Teacher:

This activity has the student spilling water so a towel or tablecloth would be helpful to protect your table.

God wants us to continue growing. It is very important to be humble in order to grow!

Let's Apply!

Fill each bowl with about one inch of water at the bottom, making sure both have the same amount of water. Each bowl represents a person, and the water represents their faith. Now, place plastic wrap over the top of one of the bowls and lay the sieve or colander over the top of the other. Try pouring a couple more inches of water into each bowl.

Draw an X on what happened to the bowl with plastic wrap. Circle what happened to the bowl with the sieve or colander.









The plastic wrap represented pride. This person started with a little bit of faith, but it couldn't grow because they thought they were more special than everyone else. People like this say and do things that make other people feel bad.

The sieve or colander represented a humble heart. This person started with a little bit of faith, but it grew into a lot of faith! People who are humble know that they are special, and they know that God made other people special too. They say and do things to make others around them feel good.

Draw a picture below of the bowl that represents who you would like to be.

Please do not worry about spelling on memory verse assignments. The goal is to memorize and understand the message of the text.

Note to Teacher:

It is recommended to start each Growing in Skills day by listening and singing along to a books of the Bible song from your preferred music source.


