



Maybe that's why those critters are using the back door these days.




My Gift


My Grandpa says we all have different gifts.

"You're right, Joy. If I lost this coin, I would be happy if someone found it and gave it back to me," Howie told her.


Joy smiled at her friend. Then they ran to Howie's house to get paper and crayons. Joy and Howie spent the rest of the afternoon making signs.
