

How to Read a Map

map is like a picture of the Earth, taken from the sky. Me show schools, neighborhoods, cities, countries, continents or even the whole world.

Maps can show land and water areas. They can also show many things, which are located on the land. For example, trees, houses, churches, post-offices and government buildings. A map of a small area, like your school, would show the playarourd the playing fields, the office and your classroom.




