ALL ABOUT CANADA Confederation

Canada became a country on July 1, 1867. The name Canada comes from the Huron and Iroquois word "Kanata," meaning "village." When Canada first became a country, there were only four provinces: New Brunswick, Nova Scotia, Ontario, and Quebec. When these provinces joined, it was called Confederation. Over the years, other provinces and territories became a part of Canada. Now Canada has ten provinces and three territories.

Canada is a country that depends on trade. Trade happens in two ways: exporting and importing. Exports are goods that are for sale or exchange to other countries. Some of Canada's major exports include aluminum, precious metals and metal ores, newsprint, lumber, wood pulp, wheat, natural gas, petroleum, and technology.


Imports are goods that a country purchases from or trades with other countries. Countries import items from other countries around the world for several reasons. They may not be able to produce or grow the item, such as oranges. Or, another country might be specialists at producing some specific product. Sometimes it may actually be easier or cheaper to buy a product from another country. Some of Canada's major imports include cars and car parts, fruits and vegetables, and technology. Most imported goods are charged a tax called a tariff.
