Teacher Input Suggestions

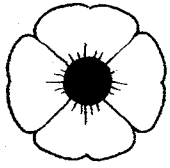
Length of Time:

This theme may be used during the entire month of November. It does not have to dwell on the ugly aspects of just war but on peace, friendship, respect, honour, the brotherhood of man, solving problems, getting along, etc.

Planning Ahead:

Look for the following items prior to the theme.

Pictures and Photographs of the Peace Tower, The National Memorial Monument, the real poppy, war scenes, military personnel, cenotaphs, monuments, memorials, military equipment, Flanders Fields, war heroes, peace symbols

Films, filmstrips and videos that pertain to World War I, World War II, and the Korean War.

Books that show the three wars, military equipment, countries where the wars were located, war leaders, war heroes, etc.

Discussion Topics:

The selection of topics and the depth in which they are discussed is left to the discretion of the teacher.

- What is a War? - causes
- World War One - causes, countries involved, results of the war, Canada's involvement
- World War Two - causes, countries involved, results of the war, Canada's involvement
- Korean War - causes, countries involved, results of the war, Canada's involvement
- Famous War Leaders from World War I and World War II - Winston Churchill, Adolph Hitler, Benito Mussolini, Hideki Tojo, Franklin D. Roosevelt
- Peace - Peace Keeping Organizations, The United Nations, The Noble Peace Prize, Lester B. Pearson, Canadian Peace Keeping Operations, The International Law of Peace
- Freedom and Its Importance; countries that do not have the same freedoms as Canada Examples: Cuba, Russia, Korea
- Symbols of Peace - dove, white flag, olive branch, The Tree of the Great Peace 1390, Calumet or Peace Pipe, peace offering, Peace International Bridge, The International Peace Gardens
- Friendship - importance, treatment
- Respect - how to show respect, why it is important
- Heroism and Heroic Deeds - brainstorm heroic acts, the attributes of a hero
- Memories - brainstorm for important memories, discuss war memories and their effects on people

Literature Ideas:

1. Choose a selection of novels the students may read during the month of November that pertain to families that lived during a wartime era. Select one of the novels to read to the class and to discuss. The novels could be read independently or as a large group reading assignment.

Examples of Books:

 - Number the Stars by Lois Lowry
 - Sky is Falling by Kit Pearson
 - Mystery at Black Rock Island by Robert Sutherland
 - Rilla of Ingleside by Lucy Maud Montgomery
 - Summer of My German Soldier by Bette Green
 - Snow Treasure by Marie McSwigan
2. Read poetry about heroic deeds, Remembrance Day, battles, war, life during the war, etc. The following are examples of poems that you might find useful in helping your students gain a better appreciation of the meaning of Remembrance Day.
