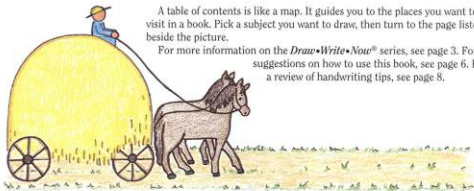


# Table of Contents
