The Parade

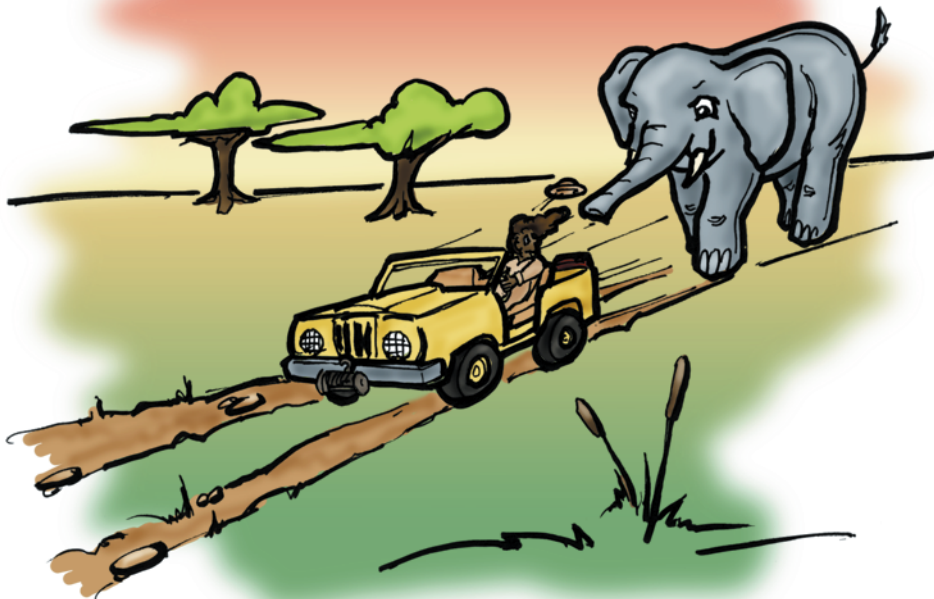
