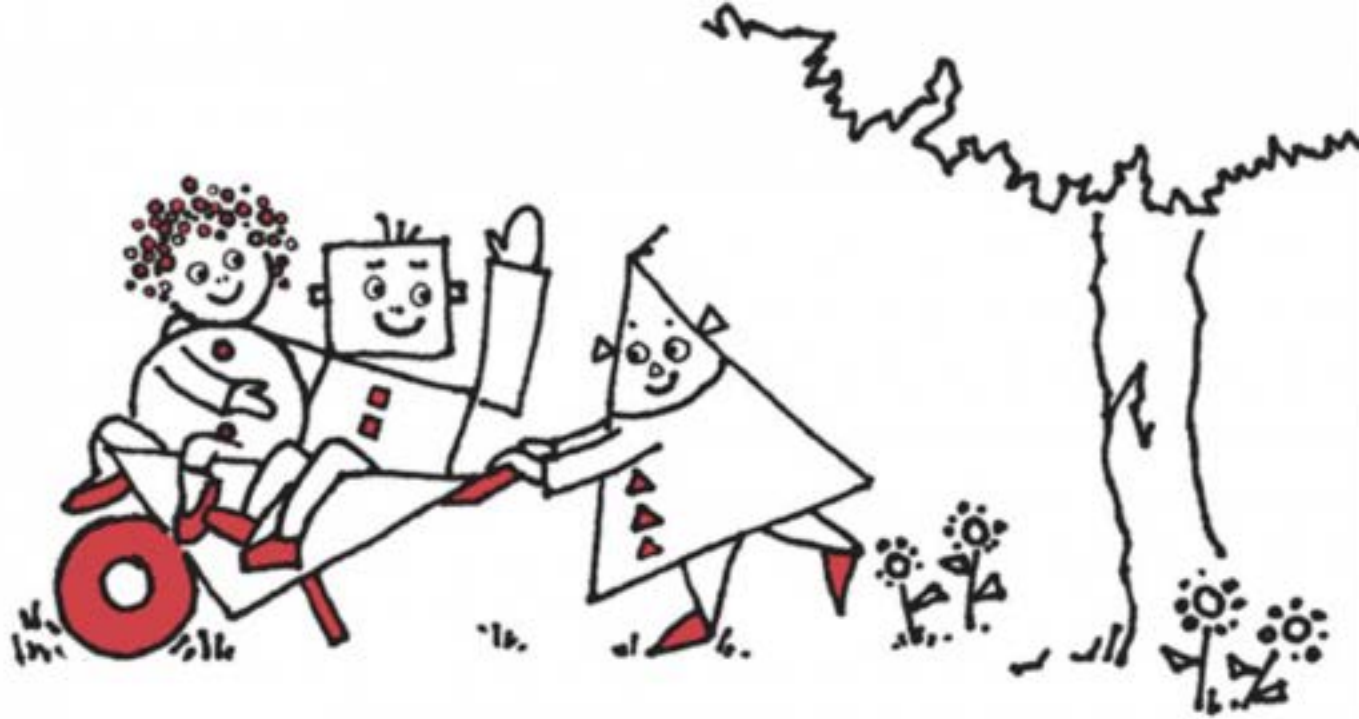


Hints About Shapes

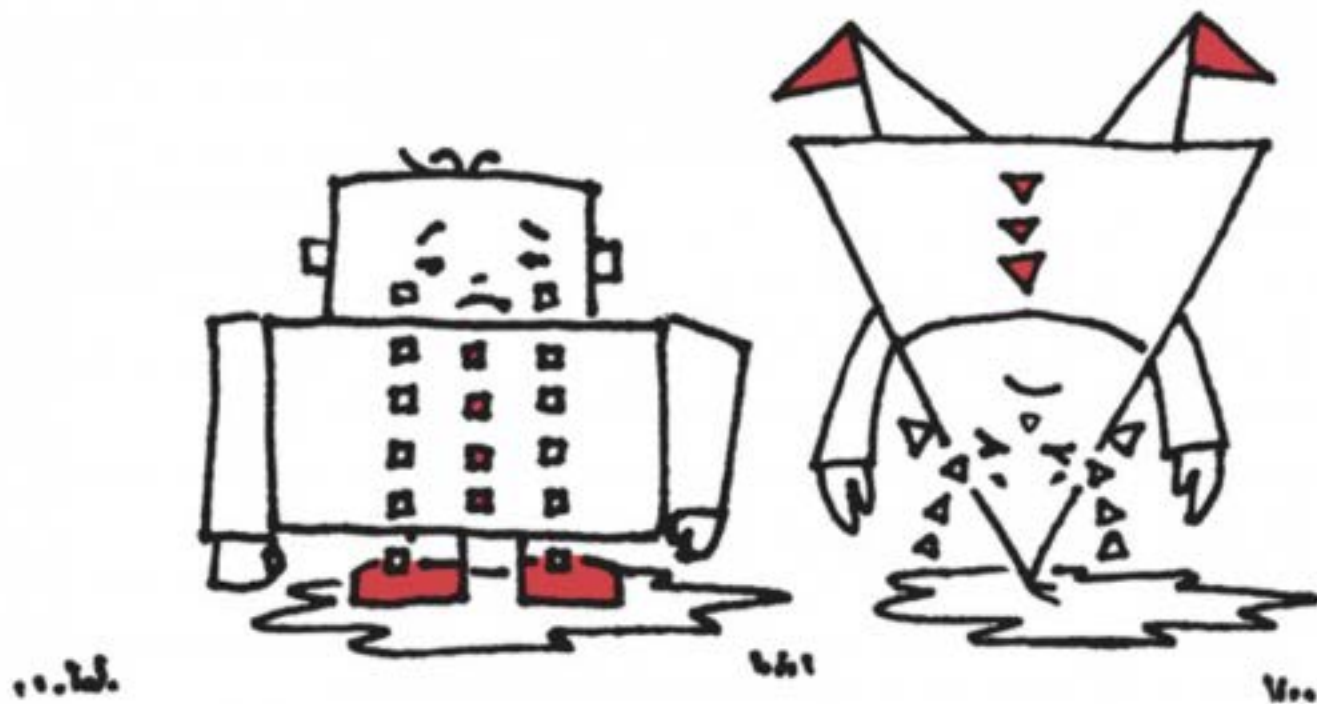
