SHORT VOWELS

Short a

THE PHONICS-SPELLING CONNECTION:

If a word has only one vowel, and it comes at the beginning or between two consonants, the vowel usually has a short sound. Short **a** is the **a** in "bat."

Long a Silent e

THE PHONICS-SPELLING CONNECTION:

If a one-syllable word has two vowels, the first vowel usually has a long sound and the second vowel is silent. Long **a** is the **a** in "gaze."

VOWEL DIGRAPHS

Digraph oo has three sounds

THE PHONICS-SPELLING CONNECTION: A vowel digraph is a double vowel that stands

for one new sound and does not follow the usual two-vowel rule (if a one-syllable word has two vowels, the first vowel usually has a long sound and the second vowel is silent.) The vowel digraph oo stands for the sounds in "moon," "book," and "flood."
