

car (kär)

n. vehicle

Mrs. Brown drove her <u>car</u> to work each morning.

care (kâr)

n., v. help another; tend to

Emma took good <u>care</u> of her toys.

face (fās)

n. front part of the head or a surface Lori looked at her <u>face</u> in the mirror.

falling (fôl' inq)

n., v., adj. lowering; dropping

The leaves were <u>falling</u> from the trees.

family (fām'ə-lē, fām'lē)

n. a group of related people

The <u>family</u> ate supper together every night.

adj. a group of related people

Mason was excited for the <u>family</u> vacation to Yellowstone.

family tree (fām' ə - lē trē)

n. a list of a person's descendants and ancestors

Mrs. Fry was working on a <u>family tree</u> project.

far (fär)

adj. lengthy; a long time

King Arthur lived in the <u>far</u> past.

adv. at a distance

Simon's grandma lived <u>far</u> from his family.

father (fä' ther)

n. male parent

Todd and his <u>father</u> liked to bike.

oar (ôr)

n. paddle for rowing

Brayden used <u>oars</u> to row the boat.

o'clock (ə- klŏk')

adv. of the or according to the clock

Church begins at ten <u>o'clock</u>.

oil (oil)

n. grease; slick

There was an oil stain under the car.

old (5|d)

n. a person of a certain age

The five-year-<u>old</u> rode her trike.

adj. a long time

Mr. Jackson's car was very <u>old</u>.

one (wŭn)

n., adj. single

Sydney could not find <u>one</u> of her shoes.

one hundred (wŭn-hŭn' drĭd)

n. the number after ninty-nine

There are one hundred pennies in a dollar.

only (on'le)

adj. alone; having no others

The Branson family has <u>only</u> one pet.

rabbit (rāb' ĭt)

n. long-eared animal

Duncan is raising a <u>rabbit</u> to show at the fair.

ran (rān)

v. to have moved quickly
J.D. ran around the track.

read (rēd)

v. to learn from writing

Anne likes to <u>read</u> funny books.

real (rēl)

adj. genuine; true

The ring was made of <u>real</u> gold.

reason (rē zən)

n. the decision or explanation behind an action or decision

The <u>reason</u> Tom was late for school was that he slept too

late.

recycle (rē-st'kəl)

v. to reuse

Erica and her family recycle many

things including newspapers.

referring (rǐ- fûr' ĭnq)

v., adj. mentioning; directing to

The teacher was <u>referring</u> to last week's lesson.

tackle (tāk'əl)

n. gear for fishing

Mr. Madsen bought <u>tackle</u> for his fishing trip.

v. to wrestle or grab a person

Chris <u>tackled</u> his friend Dan during football practice.

tagged (tagəd)

v. to have followed closely or labeled

Harrison was <u>tagged</u> it during the game.

take (tāk)

v. to have or control

The toddler needed to <u>take</u> a nap.

talk (tôk)

n., v. to speak

Natalie liked to <u>talk</u> to Sarah at recess.

tall (+ôl)

adj. having height

John was <u>tall</u> for his age.

taught (tôt)

v. directed; educated

Mr. Wilson <u>taught</u> fifth grade.

tells (†ělz)

v. to explain something

Mrs. Sanford <u>tells</u> good bedtime stories.

n. brother of a person's father or mother

under (ŭn' dər)

prep., adv., adj. below the surface; beneath

The dog hid <u>under</u> the bed.



unhappy (ŭn-hāp'ē)

adj. sad; unfavorable

unjust (ŭn-jŭst')

adj. not just or fair

The child thought the punishment was unjust.



unrepentant (ŭn' rĭ - pěn' tənt)

adj. not sorry for sin

God punished the people of Israel because they were

unrepentant.

unsafe (ŭn-sāf')

adj. not safe; dangerous
The bridge looked <u>unsafe</u>.

unwrap (ŭn-rāp')

v. to remove the covering

The children couldn't wait to <u>unwrap</u> their gifts.


